EDITORIAL

Most GT owners should be starting to be aware that with 2017 coming up it will be the 50th Anniversary of the birth of the Falcon GT.

This anniversary should be

celebrated as not only the 50th year of the Falcon GT but it was the first high performance car built in Australia.

Within a couple of years all three major manufacturers got in on the act with their own versions. The manufacturers were sucked into the 'Win

on Sunday and Sell on Monday' doctrine. It all lasted until the voter aware politicians in the early 1970's realised the high performance motoring enthusiast was a mi-

nority of voters and to take a 'safety' approach would win more votes, so they banned the further production of high performance cars, hence the Falcon GT, the Monaro and Charger were killed.

Just to show you how times have changed I can remember putting 'mags' (sports wheels) on my car and VicRoads wanting to 'outlaw' them as being unsafe. VicRoads said all cars must only have steel wheels.

Boy, look where that brainpower ended. Is there a car made today that doesn't either come with standard sports wheels or has it as an expensive option.

We see all the time, how this country lags behind many sensible

driving options enjoyed by other countries and even other states within Australia. Take the 'turn left at any time law'.

It's standard practice all over the world, obviously in left hand drive countries it relates to 'turn right at any time law'. The CEO of Vicroads

was on the ABC and when asked about this law he said the were worried about the transition period so they won't bring it in. Well, NSW didn't seem to have a problem only that it relieved traffic congestion.

Then again when the retiring VicRoads CEO said a few years ago they might have made a mistake in creating so many bike lanes in the city to reduce the traffic lanes. When asked why they did it, he said that it was considered a means by which they could slow the traffic down and 'force' motorists to ride bikes. And we really pay these people to do their job!!!

Another obvious safety measure ignored by VicRoads. In the U.S. and other countries, if a vehicle is travelling at slow speed eg 35mph (60kph) in a 60mph (100kph) highway they must have their emergency flashers activated to warn fast following traffic of their slow speed. This particularly relates to heavy vehicles climbing hills on two lane roads, seems eminently sensible to me but then again maybe not to the 'bright sparks' in our traffic department.
